

Breast Cancer Disparities, Treatments, & Advocacy Actions

The survey was developed after a breast cancer survivor luncheon was hosted. We realized a greater impact could be made with further knowledge on the population and health disparities.

A pilot survey containing 69 questions was created with Survey Monkey to begin work on gaining knowledge on the health disparity. The survey was presented to African American groups such as sororities, churches and other social groups with large percentages of African American woman. Facebook, linked in and other social media groups were asked to complete the survey.

The work needs to start somewhere, and we hope to continue beyond this pilot survey.

• We met and surpassed this objective because we reached 229


Second objective: Create a strategic plan that incorporates survey findings


- Results will be utilized to create advocacy letters.
