Over a Century of Hope 1913 to Present

For over a 100 years, for tens of thousands of people, City of Hope has been where hope begins.

In the 1920s and 1930s, the Jewish Consumptive Relief Association's reputation for compassionate care attracts supporters from around the country. Cottages become a campus of buildings. A few patients become hundreds. One nurse becomes a team of doctors and caregivers.

The Jewish Consumptive Relief Association, a group of volunteers, is formally organized in 1913.

1923

A 1955 Time magazine article features City of Hope's Howard Bierman, M.D., and his leukemia research focusing on both white blood cell production and destruction.



In 1949, the name is officially changed to City of Hope.

1943

The first Food and Drug Administration (FDA)approved human clinical trial of a stem cell-based gene transfer for HIV/ AIDS begins at City of Hope in 1997 using bone marrow transplantation technology to genetically target HIV infection.



The new City of Hope Alpha Stem Cell

City of Hope and Translational Clinic launched in 2015 thanks to an \$8 million, five-year grant from the California Institute for Regenerative Medicine (CIRM). The award is part of CIRM's Alpha Stem Cell Clinics program, which aims to create one-stop centers for clinical trials focused on stem cell treatments for incurable diseases.

In 2000, the Center for Biomedicine & Genetics is established to ensure that technological innovations are efficiently translated from the research lab to the clinical setting.



Our bone marrow transplant program reaches a milestone in 2012 - 11,000transplants for patients with leukemia, lymphoma and other serious blood diseases.

2003

Genomics Research Institute (TGen) formed an alliance in 2016 to fasttrack the future of precision medicine for patients. This alliance will accelerate research discoveries into cures for patients.

In 2017, the Diabetes & Metabolism Research Institute at City of Hope is dedicated to finding a cure for type 1 diabetes. The Wanek Family Project for Type 1 Diabetes is an initiative in the institute dedicated to finding a cure for the disease. The effort is made possible by a transformative gift from the Wanek family, and a gift from a generous anonymous donor, as well as individual. corporate and foundation partners across the country, which total \$50 million over six years.

 In 2018, City of Hope announces a collaboration with Quantum Health as a first step to change the way cancer care is delivered in the U.S. The collaboration provides a range of enhanced cancer support to patients and their physicians through Quantum Health's member services.





The Spirit of Life® Award is presented to individuals who exemplify the ideals and values that have guided City of Hope for more than a century, and whose professional and humanitarian accomplishments are worthy of celebration.

Recipients of this prestigious award include a broad range of leaders from the world of business, entertainment, science and philanthropy. What connects them is a shared commitment to elevating the human condition and a profound belief in the power of each individual to effect change.

As the industry marks 38 years of support for City of Hope, we honor that tradition with our Spirit of Life® Award Reception. Each year, more than 800 top leaders from the National Hardware/Homebuilding Industry gather to honor one person who embodies a spirit of service and unwavering dedication to helping City of Hope find cures for cancer and other lifethreatening diseases.

SPIRIT OF LIFE® GALA

It was at the 2020 Spirit of Life Award Reception, that over 800 of Bradley (Brad) Paulsen's hardware industry peers gathered to recognize and celebrate his contributions to the industry and boundless compassion for humanity.



38 Years of **Giving Hope**

- 1983 A \$10 million grant from the Arnold and Mabel Beckman Foundation establishes Beckman Research Institute of City of Hope.
- 1984 City of Hope scientists, working in collaboration with scientists at Genentech, first demonstrate that antibodies can be made using recombinant DNA technology - technology that is later used in the "smart" cancer drugs Herceptin, Rituxan, Avastin, Erbitux and other therapeutic drugs.
- 1985 City of Hope scientists develop a method for detecting carcinoembryonic antigen a substance in the body that can indicate the presence of colon cancer - using antibodies produced by engineered cells.
- 1986 The National Cancer Institute selects City of Hope as one of only six centers participating in a study of a drug called interleukin-2. Today, the drug is used to treat melanoma and kidney cancer.

- 1987 Parsons Village is built, providing a place to stay on campus for patients and family members from outside the Los Angeles area.
- 1988 A team of City of Hope scientists devise a test for detecting HIV that is more sensitive than existing methods. 1989 City of Hope scientists develop ligation mediated genomic sequencing, a new method for analyzing genetic material.
- 1990 Ribozymes, "molecular scissors," are successfully tested in City of Hope laboratories for their ability to clip out the genetic message of the HIV virus and render it harmless.
- Preventive treatment methods are developed against cytomegalovirus interstitial pneumonia, a leading cause of death following bone marrow transplantation.
- 1992 City of Hope establishes a gene therapy program and received a fouryear grant from the National Institutes of Health/National Cancer Institute.
- 1993 A research consortium including City of Hope identities as a key gene, IRF-1, that is missing in some patients facing leukemia and a related syndrome called myelodysplasia.

- 1994 City of Hope's graduate school now the Irell & Manella Graduate School of Biological Sciences - is founded.
- 1995 The National Comprehensive Cancer Network is established with City of Hope as a founding member. This alliance of leading cancer centers develops national standards of care for cancer treatments.
- 1996 The Hardware/Home Improvement Industry Legacy Research Center, a home to basic science research that fuels future advances is built. City of Hope Scientist finds long-sought direct evidence linking smoking to lung cancer by identifying the genetic damage done by active compounds in cigarettes.
- 1997 City of Hope becomes the first institution in the United States to begin testing the use of bone marrow transplantation and ribozymebased gene therapy to treat HIV/AIDS.
- 1998 The National Cancer Institute, or NCI, designates City of Hope as a comprehensive cancer center, one of only 35 in the U.S. at the time. This is the highest designation given by the NCI.










- 1999 City of Hope launches a service to connect patients to supportive resources and its first caregivers, precursors to today's Sheri & Les Biller Patient and Family Resource Center.
- 2000 Center for Biomedicine & Genetics is established to ensure that technological innovations are efficiently translated from the research lab to the clinical setting.
- 2001 The National Institutes of Health, or NIH, designates City of Hope as a national center for isolating and distributing islet cells for transplantation into patients with type 1 diabetes one of only 10 such centers at the time. Islet cell transplantation is an investigational therapy with the potential to reverse type 1 diabetes.
- **2002** In the triennial Combined Accreditation and Licensing Survey, regulators award City of Hope a score of 99 out of 100 - ranking in the top 1 percent of U.S. hospitals surveyed.
- **2003** A \$5 million grant from the NIH and the National Center for Research Resources expands City of Hope's role in the emerging field of islet cell transplantation for type 1 diabetes.
- **2004** The 2004 Patients Evaluation of Performance in California Survey, the largest patient satisfaction survey in the nation, names City of Hope as the only hospital in Southern California, and one of only four hospitals in the state, to receive the highest marks in all applicable categories from patients.

- **2005** City of Hope Helford Clinical Research Hospital opens, providing an advanced patient-care environment where the medical team delivers the newest therapies.
- **2006** City of Hope celebrates the 30th anniversary of its bone marrow transplantation program, with more than 7,500 procedures performed.
- 2007 U.S. News & World Report names City of Hope one of "America's Best Hospitals" for cancer and urology.
- 2008 The U.S. Patent and Trademark Office awards City of Hope's 200th patent for a drug designed to help fight complications of diabetes.
- 2009 Leaders dedicate two new buildings: the Michael Amini Transfusion Medicine Center and the Arnold and Mabel Beckman Center for Cancer Immunotherapeutics & Tumor Immunology.
- 2010 Scientists open a first-in-human clinical trial using genetically engineered neural stem cells that migrate to brain tumor cells and release anti-cancer chemotherapy. City of Hope launches \$1 billion Power of Hope fundraising campaign.
- 2011 Physicians perform City of Hope's 10,000th bone marrow or stem cell transplant, a milestone event for one of the largest and most successful transplant programs of its kind in the world.
- **2012** Research results show that a combination therapy developed at City of Hope may be able to cure advanced type 1 diabetes.

- 2013 City of Hope celebrates its Centennial.
- **2014** City of Hope was awarded more than \$72.9 million in research grants and received approximately \$249.8 million in revenues from patented technologies.
- **2015** City of Hope earned its sixth consecutive Press Ganey Guardian of Excellence Award.
- 2016 City of Hope announces an alliance with Translational Genomics Research Institute (TGen), one of the world's top genetics research and bioinformatics organizations and a pioneer in applying genomic analysis and bioinformatics to cancer drug development.
- 2017 City of Hope leadership gathers press from around the country to publicly announce City of Hope's goal and expectation to cure Type 1 Diabetes in six years!
- 2018 Behr Paint Company and their President Jeff Filley receive the Spirit of Life® award.
- 2019 Giles Bowman, SVP of The Home Depot receives the Spirit of Life® Award. It is a record year for the campaign
- 2020 Brad Paulsen, President HD Supply receives the Spirit of Life® Award



- Walk for Hope began in 1997 and is an annual event and peer-to-peer fundraising campaign that has raised over \$39 million for City of Hope's Women's Cancers Program.
- The 2019 Walk for Hope took place on November 3rd on the City of Hope campus.
- The 2019 Walk raised \$1.6 million.
- The number of Walk participants increased to approximately 12,000, also a roughly 33% year over year increase from 2018.
